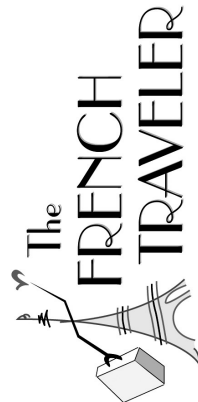
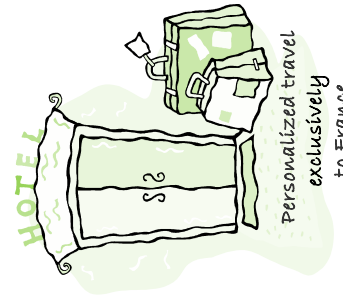

This intimate tour of the architecture, cuisine, art and history of that romantic era is well suited for both the first-time and the seasoned traveler to Paris.

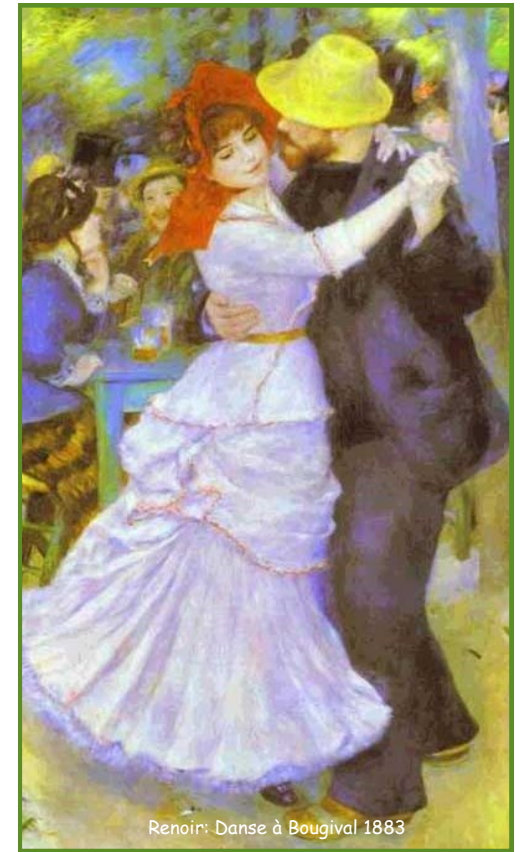

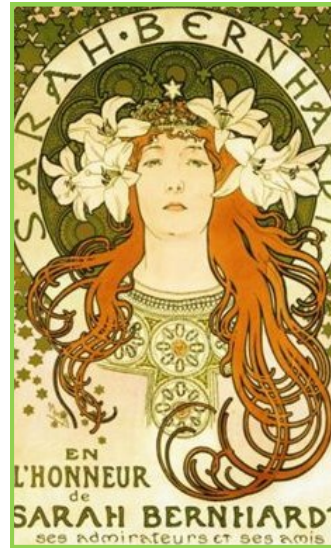
